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Read the following excerpt from a play carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Excerpt from the Play "The Enigmatic Encounter"

Olivia: A young scientist, dedicated and logical.

Elijah: A mysterious time traveler, possessing advanced knowledge. (Scene: Olivia's laboratory. Olivia and Elijah sit amidst scientific equipment, engaged in a conversation.)

Olivia: (curiously) Mr. Elijah, your knowledge of future technology is astounding. How is it possible that you possess such advanced information?

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Questions:

1. Describe Olivia's reaction to Elijah's explanation of time travel. How does her curiosity evolve throughout the conversation?
2. Analyze Elijah's metaphor of time as a tapestry. What does this metaphor suggest about his view on the interconnectedness of events?
3. Explain Elijah's idea of time as a dance between fate and free will. How does this concept challenge traditional notions of destiny?
4. Reflect on how Olivia's skepticism transforms into contemplation. What does this transformation reveal about her openness to new ideas and perspectives?
5. Consider the ethical implications of time travel discussed in the scene. What moral questions might arise if one could alter past events?
6. Predict how Olivia's newfound understanding of time travel might influence her scientific pursuits or personal beliefs in the play's subsequent scenes.
7. Reflect on the symbolism of time as clay in Elijah's metaphor. What deeper meaning might this symbolism convey about human agency and temporal existence?
